# Liars, Cheats & Storytellers


In a tradition that started with Br'er Rabbit and continues to this day, folks around here enjoy many a good tale. From a fisherman telling the story of "the one that got away" to a golfer stretching the truth just a little about the length of his drive, to a spinetingler about a ghost who lives in the house next door, the stories abound.

Eatonton has a rich literary history, and, aside from the garden-variety storytellers, has produced two very famous writers: Alice Walker and Joel Chandler Harris.



Alice Walker's book The Color Purple won both the Pulitzer Prize and the National Book Award in 1983. She has continued to produce important literary works in the years since. A self-guided driving tour takes you to some of the most significant places in Walker's early life.

Joel Chandler Harris was born in Eatonton in 1848 and raised by his mother. His first collection of folk poems and



proverbs was published in 1881 as Uncle Remus: His Songs and Sayings. In 1946 Walt Disney released the movie The Song of the South to honor Harris and the Uncle Remus stories. The Uncle Remus Museum, surrounded by a beautiful heritage garden, displays memorabilia of Harris' life and his famous critters.



## Outdoorsman Paradise

The residents of Eatonton take pride in all their town has to offer. Beautiful countryside dotted with dairy farms, cotton fields, horse pastures and scenic hay fields create a landscape that is the perfect setting for a Sunday drive. The local folks of Eatonton have a full schedule of activities for you to enjoy. The National Forest Recreation Area offers camping, hunting, fishing, beach recreation, picnic

areas and trails for hiking, horseback riding and ATV's. Lawrence Shoals Park on Lake Oconee offers a full-service campground as well as day-use areas. It has a large picnic pavilion, playgrounds, boat ramps and a public beach. Neighboring Lawrence Shoals is Rock Hawk, offering an outdoor classroom that has hundreds of educational displays along the fifteen miles of trails that surround and lead to the Rock Hawk Effigy. The displays along the trail and wetlands, and the indoor and outdoor interpretive centers near the effigy cover a wide variety of flora and fauna as well as 12,000 years of the area's history, including a history

> of Putnam County's unique large effigies. The Rock Eagle Effigy, the more famous sister mound, is located on the north side of the county along Highway 441. Both Effigies are over 2,000 years old built by a culture that pre-dates the Creek Indians.

Fishing has always been one of the favorite ways to pass time around these parts, whether casting from the

The Uncle Remus Golf Course is open year round to the public and has a generous number of tee times available. Named after the lovable character in Joel Chandler Harris' tales, it is a nine hole course in downtown Eatonton.
