Juliette started as a gristmill and a bustling railroad community during the early 1900s. As rail declined, Juliette was nearly forgotten until 1991 when movie producers for the film Fried Green Tomatoes discovered Juliette and restored the existing buildings, creating the fictional community of Whistle Stop. It is still a great place for train photo ops!

Today, Juliette is a vibrant community where guests step onto the movie set and can have their very own plate of fried green tomatoes at the Whistle Stop Café, right where Idgie sat. After lunch, you can stroll through the scenic community and browse for unique gifts or collectibles in the shops along McCracken Street. There you can get a taste of local honey from the Honey Comb, sample some wine at Southern Grace, or pick up a one of a kind souvenir in one of the delightful and quirky shops. Top off your visit by stretching your legs or fishing in the Ocmulgee River at Juliette Park, a charming oasis sure to soothe the weariest of travelers.

Located 10 minutes from the City of Forsyth (exit 186 off I-75) where you'll find the best overnight accommodations in Middle Georgia; one hour south of Atlanta; and 20 minutes north of Macon. Juliette is an ideal way to spend the day!
