Adventure Guide

Rome and Floyd Count have a long history of trail development. The Robert F. Redden **Footbridge** which connects downtown Rome to Heritage Park was Georgia's first Rails to Trails project

in 1976. The **Heritage Riverways Trail** System within the City of Rome consists of approximately 13.5 miles of paved multi-use paths and is a great way to tour the scenic river views along the three rivers that weave through downtown Rome. The **Kingfisher Trail** follows the Etowah and is easily accessed from downtown. Trail system entrances include Ridge Ferry Park, Town Green, Heritage Park, Riverview Park, Myrtle Hill Cemetery and Bridgepoint Plaza. See map on reverse for an extensive trail map of Rome & Floyd County.
