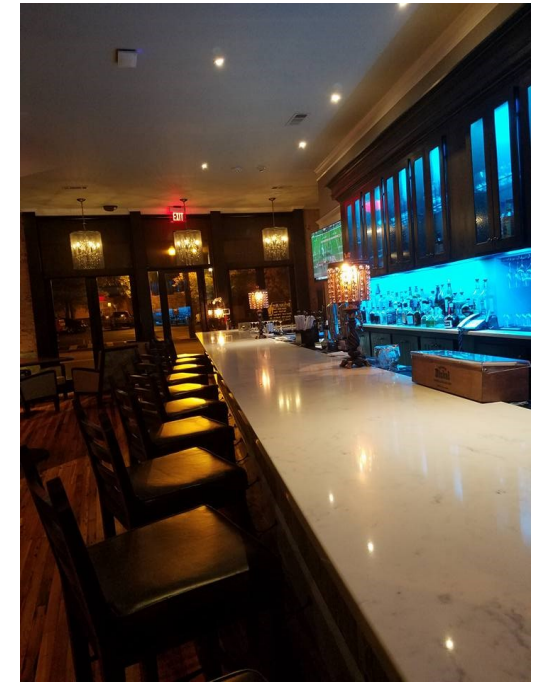

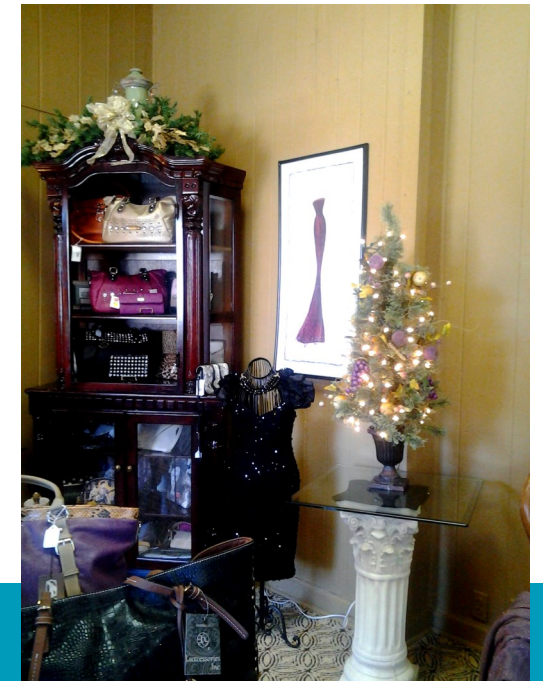

HISTORICAL SITES

WINDER TRAIN DEPOT

The Seaboard Air Line Railroad depot was constructed in 1910. Gainesville Midland Railroad also had a depot in Downtown Winder, and in 1959, a 1930 Baldwin 2-10-0 steam locomotive (Gainesville Midland No. 208 which sits under the shed at the depot) was donated to the community.

WINDER CULTURAL ARTS CENTER

Carwood Manufacturing opened this location in 1927, and soon Winder became known as the “textile manufacturing capital of the world.” Carwood turned into Duck Head Apparel, but after nearly 75 years, the doors closed and the building was left vacant. City officials purchased the building a few years later and turned it into a state-of-the-art performance theater and local television station.

BARROW COUNTY COURTHOUSE

Built in 1920 and designed by James Baldwin, the Barrow County Courthouse is younger than most historic courthouses because Barrow County was not created until 1914.

BARROW COUNTY MUSEUM

The museum, located inside the old county jail, was built in 1914. The museum houses many artifacts reflecting the history of our county.

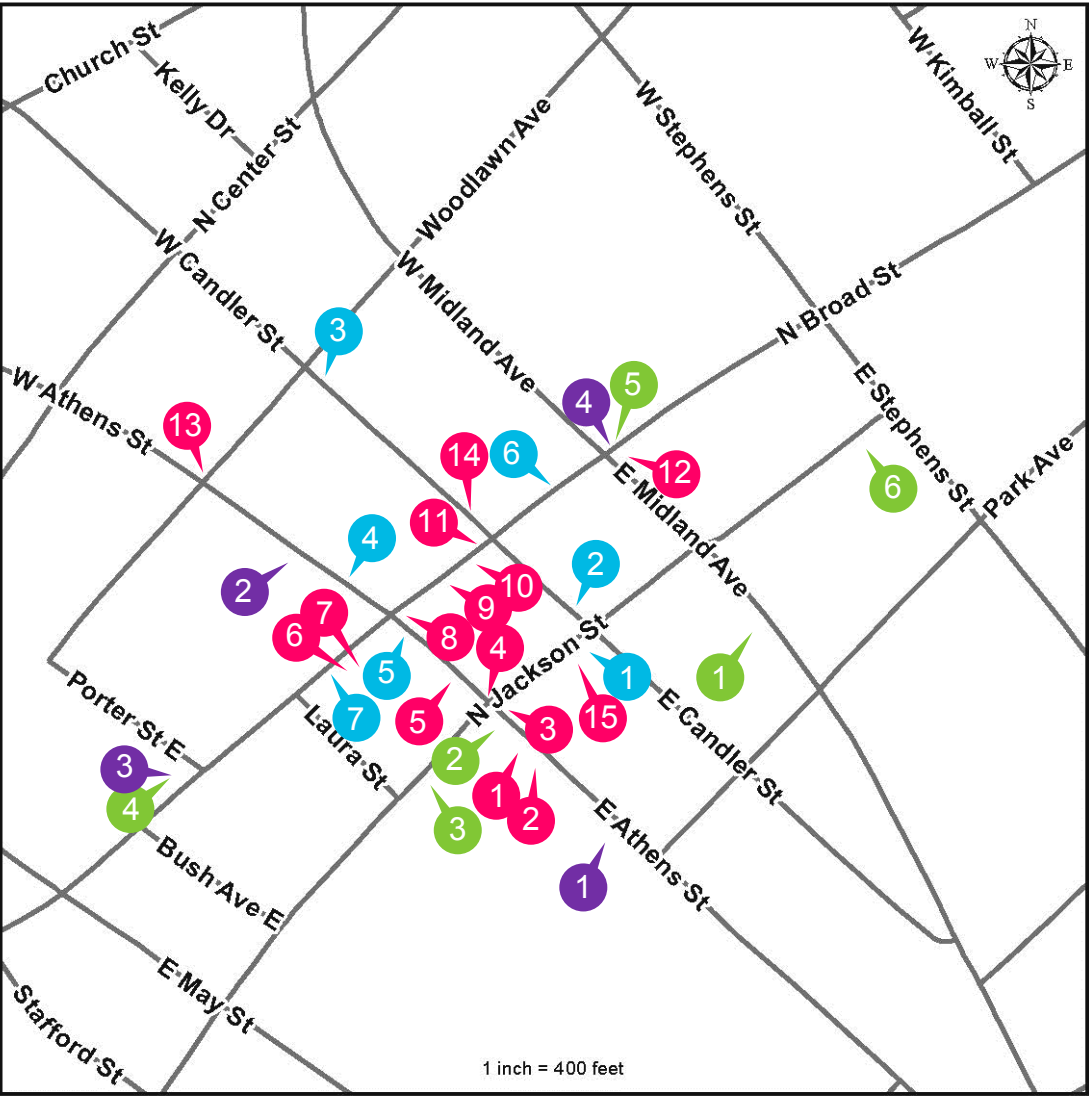
OBELISK

Winder once situated in three counties! This caused continuous legal problems and governance confusion. An obelisk sat in the middle of N. Broad Street indicating the three-county intersection. After nearly 75 years of effort, Barrow County was finally established. The obelisk now sits in the front lawn corner of the Barrow County Courthouse.

HISTORIC HOMES DISTRICT

Beautiful, historic homes line the streets of Downtown Winder on West Athens, West Candler, Church Street, Center Street, North Broad Street and Woodlawn Avenue. Most were built at the turn of the 20th century, but a handful were built before 1900. Here are a few styles you'll see throughout Winder: Queen Anne, Bungalow, Craftsman, Revivals, Foursquare and Neoclassical.
