
We Strive For

- Photograph and Media Archives local life through images and sound, and include original photographs, slides, negatives, film, and audio recordings on vinyl, cassette, CD, and reel-to-reel.
- Document Archives written primary and secondary records of our region's individuals, families, businesses, and cultural organizations, including published books about the region or produced by its citizens, government records, letters & correspondence, school yearbooks, business & organizational records, newspapers, periodicals, maps, atlases, and more.
- Artifact Collections physical objects that will connect future generations to Northwest Georgia's past, including military and school uniforms, signage and advertising from local businesses, industrial and agricultural tools, currency, and more.
- Oral History Collection recordings and transcripts documenting local histories in Northwest Georgians' own words.
